Vor vier Jahren lernte Josef Buttinger seine Lebensgefährtin Kerstin Dipplinger kennen. Gemeinsam haben sie zwei Kinder. Lara ist zweieinhalb Jahre alt, Melissa erst zehn Monate. Am 19. Juli ist die Mutter völligberraschend verstorben. Josef Buttinger ist mit den beiden Kindern völlig auf sich allein gestellt. Da er seine beiden Töchter betreut, kann er nur Teilzeit arbeiten.

The Bailiwick of Austria supports a Young Father

With much commitment the congregation of Mehrnbach, Austria, is having sympathy of the hard fortune of a young father and his two children only 2 ½ years and 10 months of age. The parents had been married only four years, when the young mother passed away quite unexpectedly. Now the father is on his own taking care of his kids, wherefore he is able to work only part-time.

Actually the Bailiwick of Austria, by the agency of bailie **Christian Fock**, who lives in Mehrnbach, caught attention of the case. "When you experience in your hos-

pital the misery of the death of a mother of two underage children, you are twice as much committed to help, as a physician and as member of a Christian Order", Christian Fock says, who is chief physician of the department of clinical radiology at the Mehrnbach hospital. Bailie Fock recently handed over a cheque for 2.500 Euro to the father. The money will be used appropriated for the children and the bank account will be managed by the congregation of Mehrnbach. Well done in the spirit of the OCM!

My name is André Lienhard and I was born (1972) and grown up in Zürich, Switzerland. After secondary school I started studies at Business School in Zürich, focused on Banking.

The following 5 years I was in charge of several functions and duties of Swiss and International Sportfederations which made it possible to travel a lot across Europe and to learn a lot of – and from -other countries, citizens and mentalities.

I was also visiting Prague where I later lived and worked for in total more then 9 years (in charge as Head of HR-Department and as a Senior consultant for Restitution belongings as well as for companies being interested to start activities in eastern part of Europe, mainly in Czech- and Slovak Republic.

After returning to Switzerland I graduated in several business educations and was then working (until spring 2015) as Head of HR-Department of a small Swiss Consulting Company with several subsidiaries in eastern part of Europe. I'm not married and I don't have children (yet).

After empeaching Masters-Degree (MBA) at the end of 2014 I succeeded to join the Swiss Military Peace Keeping unit in Kosovo (part of KFOR) as chief of personnel and after this I then wanted me to join United Nations or an NGO (f.e. like red cross) as Head of HR (maybe continental). Due to a car-accident in the military



camp in Kosovo I had to change my plannings as it is not clearly even yet what I'll be able to work in future and for how long.

In the meantime (at this time) I'm renting fully furnished rooms in Germany, Switzerland and Czech Republic.

Since 1997 I'm working as a volunteer for young people and adults in trouble, helping them to solve their individual problems and to find a job and/or education so that they'll have the chance in future to live normal life with daily work and routine. The focus is "helping people to help themselves".

At one of this meetings in Germany 1998 I got known to the members and activities of the OCM and the Bailiwick of Germany where I'm a member since then. I got member of OCM in 2001 and in October last year I've been elected Bailie of the German Bailiwick which is a big honor and at the same time - a lot of work to do not just in near future.

Annual Report 2016

The year 2016 was the 63rd operational year of Ordo Sancti Constantini Magni. The activities were conventional with the exception of the situation in the Hellenic Exarchate. Due to severe internal conflicts 32 members were excluded in the meeting chaired by the Master. The new Exarch Yannakakos begun to stabilize the Exarchate and the leadership of the organization.

The OCM stood for its responsibility of keeping good contacts and fulfilling the annual charitable support to the **Patriarchate of Alexandria**.

In addition to the donation to the Patriarchate the International Government has continued to support the children's hospice in Lahore to obtain a mobile clinic. The Government has collected a Fund for donations and is now investigating to find good targets for other donations.

The Master promoted one officer to Knight Commander of the Order.

The **Council** took responsibility in approving the budget proposal of the Government and accepting the accounting of the Order.

The **Government** steered the international work of the Order with the support of the Master. The Government held 4 meetings.

The **Executive Committee**, seated in Finland/Sweden, undertook most of the daily work.

The Master and the Government were represented at the national meetings and investitures of the Exarchates of Finland, Greece and Sweden and the Bailiwick of Austria.

The Master was chairing one Government meeting in Finland.

The Chancellor awarded, with authorization of the Master, 6 **Cross of Merit** and different ranks of the **Medal of Merit** to 28 merited Knights for their remarkable support to the Order.

If the expulsion of the members of the Hellenic Exarchate is not counted the structure of the **membership of the Order** shows slight increase. Most significant the increase was in the Exarchate of USA and the Exarchate of Sweden.

As far as reports of the Exarchates and Bailiwicks of the Order were received, they enable the Government to survey the activities of the different organizations. The number of meetings and subject matter of the gatherings differs considerable in the different national units. Many of them run charitable projects. Unfortunately most units do not deliver detailed reports.

Two issues of The Constantinian News, were edited, containing topical issues of the Order. The Vice Chancellor sent four circulars, fixed to the OCM website, containing mostly notes and actual information from the Government. Finances.

During the year 2016 The Order's financially status remained on the same satisfactory level. The annual Financial Statement of the OCM showed a surplus of 12.719,67 €. Again it was possible to reserve funds to make more donations in the future and to support the coming international events. Although the Financial status is good the income from annual fees was lower than on the year 2015. The membership development has been diversified. There is strongly growing areas but also areas which are unchanged if not regressive. This shows us the importance of recruiting new members to the Order. Only this ensures the strong basis of the OCM.


